

Inclusive Communities	
<b>Community Centre</b>	Provides planned activities and social support for frail aged and disabled clients seven days per week. Service includes a daily meal, outreach community support and some personal care within the home/community environment.
<b>Just Redgum Day program</b>	An innovative program providing work experience and training for young people with disabilities. The program focuses on personal development, work skills, social skills, workplace safety and customer relations.
<b>NDIS</b>	<p>MASP offers a wide range of NDIS &amp; Disability Services that are flexible to suit each individual.</p> <p>Our experienced passionate staff work closely with you to develop, implement and monitor progress. MASP work with people of all ages and lifestyles to live the life that they choose.</p>

MASP Properties	
<b>Short to medium accommodation</b>	A three bedroom and a two bedroom house available for lease to homeless young people
<b>Supported accommodation</b>	Supported housing for up to nine people with a mild disability, (physical and/or intellectual).
<b>Residential Care Unit</b>	Properties owned by DHHS and managed by MASP for up to 6 young people unable to be placed in foster care, with extended family or in other supported accommodation.
<b>Davison Family Units</b>	Four residential options tailored to the individual needs of young people requiring out of home care placement and assists their development towards independence and stability. Clients are supported by a live-in supervisor.
<b>Morgan House</b>	An award winning innovative housing option for young homeless people. Can accommodate up to three young people in self contained accommodation whilst being supported onsite by live-in supervisors



## AN OVERVIEW OF MASP SERVICES AND PROPERTIES



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**MASP delivers a co-ordinated range of programs and accommodation options, which facilitate the most appropriate, timely and cost effective support to people in need. This brochure gives a brief outline of all programs and services delivered.**

### Children Youth and Families

<b>Family Services</b>	A range of service interventions to vulnerable families, their children and young people to strengthen parental capacity to provide basic care, ensure safety and promote child development.
<b>Finding Solutions</b>	Supports young people and their families who are experiencing conflict and disconnection and provides an earlier intervention response to young people aged under 15 years who are risk of entering the out of home care placement system.
<b>ChildFIRST Orange Door</b>	Established in February 2009 providing information and referral for vulnerable children and families on behalf of a consortium of six integrated family services providers across the four LGAs in the Mallee region. The entry point into all Family Services across the region.
<b>Early Childhood Development Co-ordinator</b>	Responsible for strengthening the integration, linkages and partnerships between early years service providers and ChildFIRST/Family Services providers across the Mallee region to maximize the access and ongoing engagement of vulnerable children and families with universal and secondary early years services.
<b>Youth Support Service</b>	A diversionary case management service aimed at young people aged between 10 and 17 who are at risk of entering, or in the early stages of involvement with the Youth Justice System.

### Housing Access

<b>Case Management</b>	Support and assistance to people that are homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness. The goals are to assist those youth over 15, adults and families to resolve crisis, re-establish family links where possible, acquire and maintain appropriate housing and to empower them to achieve their maximum level of self-reliance and independence.
<b>Assistance with Care &amp; Housing for Aged (ACHA)</b>	Program designed to help frail, low income older people who are renting, in insecure housing or who are homeless, to maintain their tenancy and to remain active within their community.
<b>Supporting Young Parents Program</b>	Delivered in partnership between MASP, Centacare and Mallee Domestic Violence Services. The program recognizes that homeless pregnant or parenting youth are a significant vulnerable group requiring additional assistance.
<b>Intensive Case Management for Indigenous Tenancies</b>	A pilot project providing intensive support to indigenous families and singles at risk of losing their tenancy of public housing properties.
<b>Family Reconciliation Worker</b>	A program recognising that young people who are newly homeless or at risk of homelessness require early intervention responses to prevent them from entering the homelessness service system and to keep them connected to family and community.
<b>NSW Specialist Homelessness Service</b>	Assists young people (16 +) families and adults who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, including those experiencing family violence, to obtain and/or maintain safe, stable accommodation.
<b>NSW Enhanced Domestic Violence Response</b>	A free service that helps individuals living in family violence to stay safe at home. This includes women who experience ongoing abuse after separation.

### Support and Transition

<b>Residential Care</b>	Placement options for those young people (mainly adolescents aged 13 to 17 yrs) requiring out of home care but not being suitable for a family placement, lead tenant placement or independent living.
<b>Foster Care (Home Based Care)</b>	Home based placement and support to children and young people aged 0-17 referred from DHHS Child Protection.
<b>Day Support Program</b>	Provision of individual and group day programs to those young people in out of home care who are unable to attend mainstream or alternative education settings.
<b>Intensive Case Management Support</b>	Provision of support to high-risk adolescents, referred from Child Protection and who are vulnerable to self-harm and negative external influences. ICMS clients are subject to Children's Court Protective Orders.
<b>Leaving Care/ After Care Program</b>	Ongoing support to young people leaving the out of home care and statutory Child Protection systems. Assists clients with the transition from care to independent living up to when they turn 21 years of age.
<b>Youth Mentoring Program</b>	Recruits community mentors and matches them with young people requiring additional support and guidance. Part of this program can involve the completion of the Kokoda Trek
<b>Youth Justice Community Support Program</b>	Delivered in partnership with Haven Home Safe and DHHS across the Mallee, an integrated approach to the provision of intensive support and services to Youth Justice clients to complement the statutory case management undertaken by DHHS.
<b>Springboard</b>	Provision of education / employment case management response to young people aged between 16 and 21 who are or who have previously been in residential care.
